Dennis Atiyeh 00:05:00:25 00:05:23:15 He was six eight, 368 pounds. Ooh, great. Great. Tribute, I know, Joe, I, I really respect Joe. And we have become better friends with him. And I said, I

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know I like something about Joe and Joseph more of a wrestler. I'm a really, the chairman of the Republican Party said, what a what a what a wonderful guy.

I wrestled and played football at the University of Pittsburgh, had, had a great, you know, you were watching the Sugar Bowl coming up here. We watched it last week and the Cotton Bowl. I played in the Cotton Bowl. I played in the, Sugar Bowl. Fiesta Bowl. Had some some real great, great, teammates, that that I love dearly.

I'm very bothered right now by what's going on with this whole transgender competing, you know, males compete against females, and, and I, I talked with Joe when I talked with my daughter and my daughters.

So what the Tennessee as, initially as an engineer in the Air Force, I ended up changing that to a pilot, you know, became a fighter pilot, like I just said, but I got involved here in 2018 in politics and with the committee.

And one of our, biggest issues, at the time, before we had to deal with the transgender issues in the schools, was the school boards and how we we were losing control of our school boards and losing control of our schools to, liberal causes. And, whether it was financial reasons, curriculum, dei and CRT, those are the big ones then and then and then it just kept morphing into Wokeism.

Anna, your dad wanted to start off with you to talk it through a personal, direct experience. Female athlete about this issue. And, the problems that it's caused you, the struggles it's caused you and, what you feel the people in the public really need to know about it.

There aren't that many differences in, speed and strength between female, athletes and male athletes when the real issue start to come in is when males hit puberty, you always say, oh, yeah, girls are so much stronger than boys.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:12:47:10 00:13:10:16 Those young ages. But once puberty hit, there's a real difference between, the female athlete and the male athlete. That lung capacity becomes so much greater. Just the fact that males have that influence of testosterone on their body, they they have a greater,

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:13:10:18 00:13:49:25 Muscle growth and, bone density. So me being alongside my my brothers, I have three brothers who went on, played Division one sports, football and, wrestling. I, you know, I did very well, but I was nowhere, advanced as my brothers in terms of strength, speed and just their ability to jump. The differences on my volleyball net in, high school was different than the net on a on a male.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:13:49:27 00:14:10:27 Team. So I ended up, you know, going through different club sports when I was in high school. And then I went on to play Division one sports. But if I would have had, a male on the team with me. Males are like my brothers. One of my brothers is six four. Another brother is six one, you know, six foot.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:14:10:27 00:14:37:15 You don't see that that much height. Among female athletes as compared to, you know, your six nine basketball player, but you don't you don't see that among women. So I, personally, I went through a lot like grueling summers in training and, you know, having to be in the weight room lifting sports. I was one of the strongest girls on my team always.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:14:37:21 00:14:56:27 But that was nothing compared to my brothers who were also hitting the gym. Every every week, you know, every summer, like preparing for sports. My brothers. I would never try to wrestle against one of my brothers. Like, I would never, ever try to outrun one of my brothers. And, you know, we have the same genetics.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:14:57:15 00:15:20:21 More play volleyball against than you've seen on a lot of, high school teams where there is a male athlete competing against the female, that some of them are getting concussions. And like, I know, getting hit in the head. I got kicked in, in the head by a volleyball player, by one of my, friends when we were just, you know, doing stuff in a wreck league, and I got a concussion from it.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:15:20:21 00:15:37:15 But none of that ever happened from a female athlete like, you know, getting hit. You know, it's just me as a female athlete. I know how much went into it. And I know that when I competed against males in any form, it would hurt. It would really.

Annaleigh Gidosh & Dennis Atiyeh 00:15:37:15 00:15:51:26 Hurt. [Dennis Atiyeh] talk about the sacrifices you made and the clubs and the cost. I mean, the money that we spent tens of thousands of dollars in clubs and traveling. Yeah. Big events.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:15:51:28 00:16:22:17 Yeah. One of the things that like my dad and I have discussed is, is these sort of sacrifices that the average female has to make in order to get to the level of, like Division one athlete and it's, you know, men, if they're not getting hormones at a

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very young age, they're having an advantage that, like, would almost outweigh the sort of the, the sort of sacrifices that a woman has to make in order to get, to that level of, athleticism.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:16:22:19 00:16:32:25 And that's why we have a separation between female and male sports. And women suffragists fought for these sort of rights for females.

But you but you are speaking to something that maybe the public really needs to know about, and that is the sacrifice that you and probably your sisters have had to make to get to a Division one level in, in college.

But, like, like I said, with my brother, like, I know just from going up against my brothers who have, again, the same genetics as me came from the same parents like they they outran me. They out hit a ball playing against me, like if one of my brothers was just like hitting a ball at me to practice.

Annaleigh Gidosh 00:17:57:27 00:18:11:26 Like it hurt ten times worse than it would a female athlete. And I. And I'm tough like I grew up with brothers, you know, and like, I don't want to tell my brothers that they're stronger than me, but, like, that's just the reality of.

Joe Vichot 00:18:19:16 00:18:45:14 Well, I was just, thinking about one person who who did have an issue dealing with this and is very vocal now, and that's, Riley Gaines and, I'm sure you've, you know, you should reach out to her if you haven't already and join her organization, which is making a lot of headway these days of, Riley was, swimming for the University of Kentucky.

On the men's team, who then just decided he's going to be a female and just start swimming on the women's team and breaks every, you know, every record. And, and here's women like you would just say. And now here he is at the top that notch that the ladies out of, titles that notch up, which means they they lose scholarships, they lose, financial, success in going on to the Olympics. Which Dennis You know, knows about. And that affects their financial being in the future for their careers.

This year, obviously, obviously, we had a really big election and everybody was focused on the election, but, there was a lot of good pushback from, from the conservatives on, on title nine and Biden's, radical, attempted to change, title nine on their own.

And, they were able to get, the, the Supreme Court to, to deny the, actually, it all started with, in April 2024 with, with. Yeah, it was America first legal. And, so in April 2024, they, along with the Texas, attorney general, they were able to secure a preliminary injunction on Biden making those changes to title nine.
